

signifies the social position), it will be best for her not to enter into such a union, which is sacrilege unless there is mutual love. Besides, as said, she will by her own efforts become very comfortably situated and be much happier without marriage.

CARLOS DE U. — Born April 18, 1915, 10:15 p.m., Brighton, England.

Seeking the mental caliber of Carlos, we find that Mercury is in the martial sign Aries and that it rises *before* the Sun. This always makes for a bright mind. We also find the Moon in the mercurial sign Gemini and sextile to Mercury. This is another favorable indication. Then we find that Uranus, the planet of intuition, is in the intellectual sign Aquarius sextile to Mercury and trine to the Moon, showing that the youngster will have an exceptionally brilliant mind. Furthermore, Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is also in Gemini and sextile to the Sun so that it is absolutely safe to designate Carlos as a genius of an exceptional nature. Moreover, he will not be erratic, on account of the restraining hand of Saturn already mentioned.

We would urge you, however, to be careful to restrain him during the earlier years, for both Mars and Sun are in Aries, which rules the head. This gives too much heat in the brain, and there is a square aspect between Saturn and Mars demanding caution. Let him learn whatever he wants to himself, be it little or much, but do not force him and try to make an infant prodigy of him, for that may have

serious consequences. . It is far better to train his body during the earlier years so that it may become a fit instrument of a great mind later in life. You should be especially careful in respect to his food, for Saturn is on the cusp of Cancer, which rules the stomach, and that means there is a tendency to indigestion if Carlos is allowed to have his own way with food. He will want to eat more than he can take care of on account of Mars in Aries.

You will find that he is not going to be an easy child to bring up, with Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, in Aries, together with the Sun. He will be very impulsive and self-willed and Saturn being about to enter Cancer, the fourth sign which signifies the home, will render him resentful of parental authority in particular. We would therefore advise that you mark out a definite line of conduct which will allow him freedom in all unessential things, so that you may not form the habit of always saying "Don't." But, on the other hand, the things which you settle by careful study of the matter as being essential and requiring obedience for the child's good should be enforced from the earliest childhood.

We do not believe in corporal punishment, but every child likes certain things which are delicacies, and if a disobedience is always followed by a denial of these things the child usually learns to bow to the will of the parents. You will also find that he has a temper, and if this makes it impossible to guide him by ordinary means, it is a good plan to place a mirror in a corner of the room and seat the child so that he is forced to look into this glass and there see his face distorted with tears and anger. This treatment will quickly

make him smile and he can then be taken out of the corner.

When you buy toys for Carlos, select those which are mechanical and electrical in preference to others, for as Uranus and the Moon are sextile to Mercury and placed in airy signs, it is evident that his talents will lie in the direction of inventions that have to do with electricity and the air. For that reason toys of the nature suggested will help to bring out in him the latent ability to a much better advantage than if he were given dolls and blocks to play with. Neptune in the eighth house and in the psychic sign Cancer will give him a love of the occult, but as the Sun is square from the sign Aries which governs the head, his experiences in this direction will have a mentally disturbing influence. He is apt to be pestered by spirit controls and he should, therefore, be kept away from such things.

HENRY F. — Born July 4, 1905, 12:30 a.m., Schenectady, New York.

Here we have a youngster coming into the world amid the rejoicing incidental to the nation's birthday, with Taurus on the ascendant and the gentle Venus and Jupiter rising, sextile to the Moon and Mercury, signifiers of mind, thus giving him a benevolent optimistic disposition. Although this is somewhat toned down by the square of Saturn, the planet of obstruction, to Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, it will, nevertheless, have the tendency to turn the corners of Henry's mouth upward and give him a feeling of optimism even under trying circumstances. Thus he will become popular among

his associates, for such people are always well received and much sought after. There is no truer saying than "Laugh and the world laughs with you, weep and you weep alone."

Mercury is ruler of the second house, which governs finances, and the Moon always brings into action any planet wherewith she is in aspect. We may therefore judge that the aspect of the Moon and Mercury to Jupiter, the planet of opulence, will give Henry an ample income. However, the eleventh house position of Saturn in the twelfth-house sign Pisces, square to Jupiter, shows that Henry's friends, particularly people who are older than himself, will cause him financial trouble unless he can learn in time to keep out of their clutches. He should be taught to discriminate between friends who only seek him for their own self-interest and to his detriment, and those who really seek him for himself.

The conjunction of Neptune with the Sun in the psychic sign, Cancer, shows Henry to be mystically inclined, and the sextile of Mercury and the Moon to Jupiter and Venus will further accentuate the religious tendencies. Moreover, since Henry is not by any means a negative character he will profit considerably from these configurations without danger to himself.

The indications regarding Henry's health are exceedingly favorable. Venus and Jupiter rising in the rugged sign Taurus give him a strong robust body, and the Sun, which is the giver of life, trine to Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, shows that he will have an abundance of vital energy all through life. There is only one adverse testimony: Saturn, the planet of obstruction, is square to Jupiter, the planet which governs the arterial circulation. This we believe is more

than offset by the trine of Sun and Mars though it may give Henry poor circulation in the feet, which are governed by the sign Pisces, where Saturn is found. The sextile of Jupiter and Venus placed in the ASC in Taurus, sextile to Mercury and the Moon, shows musical talent, which should be cultivated. Probably that is the best vocation for Henry, for we find Virgo and Libra in the sixth house, indicating that his service to the world should come from Venus and Mercury.

JOSEPHINE M. — Born May 10, 1905, 4:15 p.m.,  
Mountain Home, Idaho.

Here we have a young lady with an exceedingly well-fortified seventh house. There we find the Sun, which for a woman is the significator of the marriage partner; Jupiter, the planet of benevolence; Venus, the planet of love and coalition, and Mercury, the principal significator of the mind. There can, therefore, be no question that Josephine's sphere of life is in the home. There are all the elements of success for her in this life. The Sun and Jupiter, the planet of opulence, on the cusp of the eighth house which indicates the finances of the marriage partner, shows that he will be well-to-do and generous.

There is also an element of trouble immanent in this figure, though, which will come from Josephine herself, and unless it is checked it will mar her happiness. Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, is in Scorpio in opposition to the Sun and Jupiter. This will give her a very violent temper, and the marriage partner will be the particular victim thereof. We

find the Moon, which is one of the significators of mind, in the sign of the heart, Leo, and square to Mercury and Venus in Aries, the sign of the head, showing that Josephine will develop an exceedingly jealous nature which may eventually cause a rupture in the marriage relation. On account of these indications, it is the first duty of the parents to strive from the very earliest childhood to teach her control of temper. She is now at an age where these things can be explained to her by the object lessons which, unfortunately, are only too frequent occurrences in our social life. She also has a strong tendency toward reckless extravagance on account of the influence of Mars in the second house, which governs finances. This ought to be checked as much as possible.

With regard to her health, Mars in Scorpio, opposition the Sun, shows a tendency toward copious menses, for Scorpio governs the genitals. It would therefore be well for the parents to instruct her carefully in advance of the occurrence so that she may know how to take care of herself and not become unduly frightened. Saturn in Pisces, the sign which governs the feet, shows a tendency to cold in these extremities, and for one with the aforementioned tendency that may cause serious consequences, which you would do well to guard her against in the severe northern climate where you are living. The Moon square Venus and Mercury also indicates disturbances to the health, particularly through over-indulgence in pleasure and worry. There is a tendency to be very sarcastic and quicken-spoken, which you should endeavor to curb by reasoning with her, for such an attitude of mind causes unpopularity, and the worry that follows has a reflex action upon the health. Fortunately, however, it is

possible for a person who has the will to modify the influences indicated in the horoscope and thus change the undesirable tendencies to something better.

FRANCES W. — Born September 15, 1903, at 11 p.m., Seattle, Washington

Here we have a young lady of unusual ability in the occult direction. Uranus in the mental sign Sagittarius, sextile to Mercury, the significator of mind, shows her to be a very ingenious, independent, and original thinker; Jupiter, the planet of religion, in the zenith position, essentially dignified in the mystic sign Pisces, trine to Neptune on the ASC in the psychic sign Cancer, shows in another way an extreme occult ability. Furthermore, as the tenth house shows the social position and prestige, we judge from Jupiter's presence there that she may in time attain a national or perhaps an international reputation. The aspects being from watery signs show a great deal of travel in connection therewith, though it should not be forgotten that these testimonies are somewhat minimized by the fact that Jupiter is retrograde. However, it is certain that she has an unusual ability to delve into the occult.

Frances' inspiration and intuition are far above the normal, and the Sun conjunction Venus in the mercurial sign Virgo shows her to be of a kind-hearted and sympathetic nature, though the Moon square Mercury indicates that she may be very quick-spoken and impatient of others who do not grasp things as quickly as she. This tendency should be checked for it will make her unpopular if indulged and allowed to grow. From this aspect she also gets a tendency to worry over things which never come to pass, but perhaps that is natural for sensitives. They are very much exposed to the conditions of others, it being difficult to differentiate between

what really affects oneself and what comes from other people. At least, it takes an effort to make the distinction, which one is not always prepared to make, nor is one always conscious that such an effort is necessary.

The Sun and Venus sextile to Mars shows that Frances will be very popular and attractive to the opposite sex, which is both proper and legitimate. There is also a square of Sun and Venus to Uranus, the planet which loves liberty and hates conventionality. This means that unless she is very circumspect she is likely to be taken advantage of and become the subject of a scandal. You will, therefore, do well to instruct her in regard to these matters and look after her very carefully until she has finally settled down. However, you need have no fear regarding the ultimate outcome. The Sun conjunction Venus in the fourth house is one of the best testimonies of a home life filled with love and happiness, especially in the latter part of life, for it makes the fortunate person who has it so loving and companionable that all about her feel her charm. This aspect is also a good indication of comfortable financial circumstances, so that, though there may be some trouble in life, it may be said that on the whole Frances has a most fortunate life before her.

With respect to health, we find that the Moon is rising in Cancer and square to Mercury in Libra. This shows a somewhat delicate constitution with the stomach and kidneys as the weaker points from which trouble may be expected. The constitution, however, is considerably strengthened by Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, sextile to the lifegiving Sun. Saturn is fortunately unaspected and retrograde but, nevertheless, he always makes some trouble wherever he is



placed or from the opposite point. As he is in Aquarius and the opposite sign is Leo, which governs the heart, we may judge that it will have a slightly obstructive effect upon the circulation, and this will most probably be felt in the ankles which are governed by Aquarius. More damage is done to the heart during careless, impatient, impulsive youth than in after years, and as the constitution of Frances is none too strong, every slightest strain counts. We would, therefore, advise you to acquaint her with these facts so that she may learn to husband her energy from the earliest possible time, and thus prevent trouble in the later years.

HENRY B. W. — Born Nov. 6, 1914, 9:20 a.m., Luling, Texas.

Here is a youngster with a well-developed wanderlust, indicated by an essentially dignified Mars in the watery sign Scorpio on the ASC, trine to Neptune in the ninth house, which governs travel. The wandering Moon is posited in the mercurial sign Gemini to further accentuate this tendency, and the Sun square to Uranus, which is the great inculcator of personal freedom and liberty, shows that Henry will always be looking for a change, always hastening toward the far fields that look so much greener than the ones where he happens to be. This is so ingrained in his nature that we believe it will be useless for you or him to combat it. It is not a bad tendency, either, for it certainly gives breadth of view and experience. It makes life interesting. People with such tendencies are rolling stones that gather no moss in the shape

of worldly possessions, but they usually accumulate a fund of knowledge that is very valuable to the Spirit. After all is said and done that is what counts, for no one can take his material possessions along with him when he passes through the gate of death, but whatever knowledge he has acquired will stay with him through eternity. The trine aspect between Mars and Neptune shows, however, that Henry will enjoy the roving life and find a happiness therein, so that even from the standpoint of present conditions there are no regrets necessary.

Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, rising in its own sign, Scorpio, will give Henry an abundant fund of physical vitality, but it will also give him the tendency to be quick-tempered and impatient with others. This tendency is modified by the mental significations, however, which are quite interesting. Mercury, the planet of mind and reason, goes before the Sun, which is good, but it is too close to the Day-star and square to Jupiter. The Moon also, though placed in the mercurial sign Gemini, is unseparated. Thus Henry will never be a good reasoner. If he should rely upon that faculty in his dealings with the world he would always be subject to trouble and loss. But Venus, the planet of love, is sextile to Uranus, the planet of intuition, and Jupiter, the planet of benevolence. This modifies the other mental significations and smoothes out the temper indicated by Mars on the ASC in Scorpio, so that Henry will intuitively and without the use of his reasoning faculties arrive at conclusions which will generally be found to be correct. We say generally, because the square aspect between Jupiter and Mercury affects this in-

dication in a slightly adverse manner, but he will grow up to be an exceedingly bright young man with an inclination toward invention, particularly in the line of electricity and aerial instruments. The square aspect of Jupiter to the Sun and Mercury in the twelfth house shows that he ought to be careful in the way he handles these forces, for otherwise they will be somewhat dangerous to him.

With respect to health we find that Saturn is in the sign Cancer, which rules the stomach. This shows that Henry ought to be careful in his diet or indigestion will result in time. If you teach him frugality by your own example and also preach this doctrine to him during childhood it will undoubtedly have a beneficial effect and save him much misery. Mars in Scorpio on the ASC shows a strong tendency toward constipation, which is an adjunct of indigestion. The child should be taught from the earliest years to be regular in his elimination and always follow the call of nature, no matter where he is. Save for these two weak points the constitution is strong, and the general health will be good if he is taught to overcome the weakness indicated.

MILDRED COSTA I. — Born Jan. 20, 1916, 9:38 p.m., Los Angeles, California.

Four cardinal signs were on the angles at the time of Mildred's birth, giving her an inherently active and restless disposition. Uranus, the intuitional, spasmodic planet, is in conjunction with Mercury in the intellectual sign Aquarius. This gives her an original, intuitive, quick, and alert mind,

with a tendency, however, to be very independent and resentful of restraint and restriction. She will want her way regardless of the conventionalities.

The Moon, which is another significator of mind, is in opposition to Uranus. This will further strengthen the imagination and make it exceedingly fertile, so that we have before us a very unusual character which the parents will find it very difficult if not impossible to train. Most of the planets are in fixed signs, and the saying "If she will she will, and you can depend upon it, if she won't she won't, and that's the end on it," applies with particular force to Mildred. However, you have seven years at least before you in which much good work may be done, and you have some unusually promising material to work with before the vital body, which is the vehicle of habit, has set and the undesirable tendencies have become ingrained. She is very much in need of poise and self control to guide her unusual ability into proper channels, and now is the time for her to learn it, if ever. Be sure that you use moderation, though.

Mildred has Saturn, the planet of obstruction, in Cancer, the fourth sign signifying the home. This shows the restraining hand of parents, but it should be laid on as lightly as possible, for there is nothing that kills ambition and breaks the progressive spirit in a child as much as the parental "Don't, don't, don't."

Financially, Mildred will be well taken care of, for the Sun, which infuses life into all things it touches and that come in contact with its rays, is sextile to Jupiter, the planet of opulence. Jupiter's position in the sixth house, which governs service, shows that she will always be popular with em-

ployers and other employees. She will indeed be so well liked that people in high and fixed positions signified by the Sun will, by their influence, secure her promotion to a place of prominence. Should she become an employer herself or have charge over other employees she will be very successful, and popular in the management of them, gaining much through them. Not so with respect to friends, though, for in the eleventh house we find the Moon in opposition to Uranus, and Mars in opposition to Venus. This shows that her friends will always seek to use her for their own benefit and then slander her behind her back. Therefore, Mildred should be very careful in the selection of her friends. People who have such original dispositions are always likely to be misunderstood and therefore be the subject of slander.

With respect to health, we find Uranus in conjunction with Mercury and in opposition to the Moon from the signs Leo and Aquarius, which govern the spinal column, and Neptune is in opposition to the Sun, which is also on the cusp of Aquarius. This will give Mildred a supersensitive, nervous disposition which should not be unduly taxed. It is like a fine watch or chronometer which needs to be in a balanced frame. It is much more valuable than a cheap alarm clock but cannot stand the same rough treatment. So it is with Mildred. She is too sensitive to withstand severe nervous strain, and during the school period it will be best for her not to study too hard. She will learn far more intuitively than her schoolmates by the hardest kind of a grind.

The Moon, which governs the female functions, is in opposition to Uranus, the spasmodic planet, and therefore you may find her irregular in her menses, but the life-giving Sun is sextile to Jupiter, the planet of plenty. This gives good fortune and good measure in health as in wealth and happiness, counter-balancing the minor tendencies, so that on the whole Mildred will enjoy good health through life.

ROBERT LEONARD L. — Born Oct. 18, 1907, 9:30 a.m., Spokane, Washington.

One glance at this horoscope is sufficient to show us that Robert will be a very versatile character. The planets are scattered over the greater part of the horoscope, and we find Mercury, the planet of reason, in the martial sign Scorpio, showing that he is mentally energetic, quick, and alert, though not impulsive, for Mercury is singularly well-aspected. It has a trine to Saturn, the planet of obstruction, which gives caution, tact, diplomacy, forethought, and the ability to concentrate deeply upon any subject so that he may know what he is going into before actually taking the venture. Mercury is also trine to the Moon, which is co-significator with him of the mind. This helps to strengthen the imagination and gives the ability to visualize the thoughts and ideas conceived by him. Finally, Mercury is trine to its higher octave Neptune, which is placed in the psychic sign Cancer. This will have a tendency to bring Robert in touch with occultism, for the configuration occurs from the eighth and twelfth houses. It will make him sensitive to the vibrations from the invisible worlds and may be the means of giving him psychic experiences of a nature that will benefit him spiritually.

We find Jupiter, the planet of religion and philosophy, in the ninth house, governing the higher mind. This will make Robert's nature benevolent, helpful, and sympathetic. It will give him high aspirations and bring him much esteem in the community in connection with social and religious work. The Sun and Venus placed in the eleventh house, the house of friends, hopes, and aspirations, is a good omen in that re-

spect. Robert will meet with many friends, people higher in the social scale, who will help him advance in life. He will also find many friends among the opposite sex, but as Venus is sextile to Uranus, the planet of originality and independence, we may judge that his relations with them will be rather too unconventional.

Venus in Scorpio square Mars, the ruler of Scorpio, will give him unusually strong sexual tendencies, and there are indications that this may bring him into trouble, besides sapping his vitality. We believe it would be wise for you to take Robert to a physician that it may be determined whether circumcision is advisable. Where there is a superfluity of flesh there is also an irritation which additionally excites an already abnormal tendency, and the removal thereof does much to relieve the person afflicted with an intense passional nature.

Saturn in Pisces, which governs the feet, shows that Robert will have a poor circulation in the extremities, which may react in the intestines governed by the opposite sign Virgo, but as Saturn is unafflicted there will probably be no serious inconvenience. Had this been a female horoscope the conjunction with the Moon would have affected the health much more seriously by obstruction of the female functions. As it is, the effect will probably be confined to cold feet.

In respect to finances, we see Uranus in the second house and sextile to Venus, and Mars also in the second, square to Venus. This shows that Robert will always have considerable money. He has an excellent earning power, but we also find that there will be a tendency to squander his substance on the opposite sex. He has already passed the plastic age, and unfortunately the indications occur from fixed signs so that you

will probably find it difficult to change him now. However, it is better to make the attempt late than not at all. We would advise that when you give him an allowance you should require him to give an account of how he has spent it and advise him what is right and what is wrong in that respect. There is one blessing: he has a reasonable mind and you may be able to show him logically which is the best course for him to pursue. We would also advise that you teach him the sacredness of sex, together with the dreadful consequences attendant upon the abuse thereof. He has a very strong will power, and if you can convince him of these matters, it is quite possible that he may be able to rule his stars in that respect. At least he will not go blindly into something with which he is unacquainted. His eyes will be opened and there is the possibility that he may catch himself up sooner than if he is not warned at all.

ARMINAE B. — Born June 11, 1915, 5:24 p.m., Seattle, Washington.

At the time of Arminae's birth we find the energetic sign Scorpio rising and Mars, the ruler, sextile to Mercury. This gives her a quick and alert mind, able to grasp an idea the moment it is presented. At the same time, she is not impulsive, for Mercury, the planet of reason, is in conjunction with Saturn, the planet of obstruction. This acts as a brake upon impulse and gives her the ability to concentrate upon whatever subject comes under her notice, but unfortunately, this position also carries with it the tendency to the blues and evil



forebodings, especially when placed in the lunar sign Cancer.

The Moon, planet of imagination, is in the mercurial sign Gemini, trine to Uranus, the planet of intuition, placed in the intellectual sign Aquarius. This further sharpens the intellectual faculties so that it will not be necessary for her to reason upon things in order to arrive at a correct conclusion; she will gain the solution to her problems mostly by intuition. This configuration will also give her originality and independence of thought.

With respect to marriage, we find that Venus, the planet of love, is essentially dignified in her own sign Taurus, sextile to Jupiter, the planet of benevolence, also essentially dignified in the sign Pisces. Venus is placed in the seventh house, indicating the condition of marriage, sextile to Neptune in the fourth sign Cancer, and Jupiter is in the fourth house. Thus conditions are extremely favorable for a happy marriage and a contented home life. But the Sun, which indicates the marriage partner in a woman's horoscope is on the cusp of the eighth house, indicating his financial condition, and square to Jupiter, the planet of opulence, in the fourth house. This shows that there is a liability to financial difficulties and loss, but there are no indications of poverty. Quite the contrary.

There does not seem to be any particular or glaring fault in Arminae, and the general state of the health is also good. Saturn in Cancer always gives a tendency toward some peculiarity in the choice of food, and if this is indulged in his conjunction with Mercury will cause nervous indigestion. But even this will probably not be of a very aggravated nature in her case, as the planets are full six degrees apart and therefore weak

in their operation. So to sum up: the life is shown to be a quiet and contented one, passed mostly in the home and filled with the cares and pleasures of a family.

ELLIS ELDON D. — Born Feb. 25, 1907, 3 p.m., Harper County, Oklahoma.

This is a strong horoscope, strong for good and for bad. There are four cardinal signs on the angles, giving Ellis an active, energetic nature. Saturn, the ruler of the Capricorn ASC, is in conjunction with Mercury. This deepens the mind and gives him power of concentration, but also a tendency to look upon the dark side of things. This, however, is considerably modified by a sextile to Venus, the planet of love, light, and cheerfulness, so that probably the gloom will not be as deep as otherwise. Furthermore, the life-giving Sun is trine to Jupiter, the planet of optimism, also to Neptune, and sextile to Uranus, the planet of intuition. These are all influences which brighten the disposition and throw sunshine into the life.

However, Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, is in the twelfth house, indicating sorrow and self-undoing, square to Saturn, the planet of obstruction. This indicates that Ellis will have an unusually quick and violent temper, which is apt to bring him into trouble. It makes the nature cruel, selfish, and deceptive, and on that account it breeds enmity with those about him. It even indicates a liability to imprisonment. Unfortunately, he is already ten years of age, and the best period for work with him is therefore past. Nevertheless, the afflic-

tion occurs from common or flexible signs, and there are so many other good traits in this horoscope, that it seems that even now you should be able to mould his character in such a manner that you will at least minimize the tendency. Probably you have already noticed these characteristics in embryonic manifestation and have already battled with them. In that case, it should be possible to help him overcome. Above all things, try to teach him how to curb his temper, for without doubt whatever trouble comes to him will be because he loses control of himself and acts rashly on the impulse of the moment.

So far as the financial fortunes go, Ellis will have many ups and downs in life. The Sun is trine to Jupiter, the planet of opulence, so that at times fortune will smile upon him and give him abundantly of the world's goods, often in the most sudden and unexpected manner, as indicated by the sextile of the Sun and Uranus. But then, the square of Mars from the twelfth house, the house of sorrow, will bring losses and financial difficulties. He will have a considerable amount of money, but will not be able to keep it.

Concerning health, the constitution is physically strong, but the square of Mars to the Sun and Saturn shows a liability to colds and fevers, inflammatory diseases and accidents, a sensual nature which will sap his vitality. In short, as we said in the beginning of the horoscope reading, it is a strong nature divided between good and bad, and according to whatever he chooses the life will be happy or unhappy. There is one blessing, though, in that this horoscope shows a considerable amount of latitude of free will, so that Ellis will have a chance to choose for himself without being very seriously handicapped.

If you can only aid him in the matter of self-control, you will minimize the tendencies to trouble wonderfully, and enhance his chances for a successful and happy life in the same degree.

MILDRED B. — Born April 6, 1905, 11:15 a.m., Wichita, Kansas.

Here we have an interesting young lady who is a natural inspirational musician, as shown by the four planets in Taurus, the sign of art and music. We find Venus, the planet of love and harmony, there, and in this sign she is essentially dignified; we also find the Moon, which fructifies everything on earth, talents included. There is also Mercury, the planet of expression and dexterity, giving Mildred the ability not only to learn music and love music, but to perform and express herself in that manner, and last but not least, Jupiter, the planet of devotion and ideals. These planets are all in the eleventh house which rules hopes, wishes, and aspirations, showing that Mildred's ideals and ambitions will be realized, and we may also say that the Sun is in its exaltation sign Aries, where it is very strong and powerful. It travels one degree a year approximately from the time of birth. Thus at fourteen years of age it enters the sign Taurus, and at eighteen comes in conjunction with Mercury, then the Moon, then Jupiter and Venus. So from the age of eighteen to twenty-five Mildred may expect her dreams to be coming true in a most wonderful manner, and at twenty-nine when the Sun comes in conjunction with Venus she will meet a life companion and gain her heart's desires, for the Sun in a female horoscope always signifies the marriage partner.

Mildred is not one who floats in the skies and dreams dreams only, for Saturn, the planet of tact and diplomacy, concentration, system, virtue, etc., is sextile to Mercury, the Moon, and Jupiter. This will give her a level head and clear, keen reasoning powers. There is, however, a "but" to all this and an "if." That is to say, we find that the Sun, which is the giver of life, and Mars, which is the planet of dynamic energy, are unaspected. Both of them are strong, the Sun is highly elevated and exalted, and Mars is essentially dignified in Scorpio, but being unaspected they are not as strong factors in the horoscope as when configured with other planets. Therefore she may not have or express the proper energy necessary to realize all the best there is in her life, and she should be made to realize clearly that the horoscope only shows tendencies but does not bring things to pass unless we work with it.

It is necessary for everyone to help their stars, or their stars cannot help them. Let us take an illustration.. The human system is to a great extent automatic, and when we have accustomed ourselves to eat dinner at twelve o'clock, then we will automatically feel hunger at that time. Thus we are being urged by this craving for food to go and get our dinner, but though the craving may appear, unless we walk to the table and do the physical work of eating and masticating our food, the hunger will remain. It is the same with the aspects in the horoscope. They will give the inner urge and the opportunity for the realization of every quality and everything good or bad, but unless we ourselves help to bring these things about they will remain latent. Mildred is old enough now to understand this point and realize that

she must do some work herself or otherwise the things indicated in her horoscope cannot come to pass. She cannot develop her musical faculties by just simply sitting down and dreaming of some day being in a grand concert hall where she is the cynosure of all eyes and all ears while she is producing marvelous symphonies. She must go through the usual course and begin with little things before she can do great ones. She must do the work and then in time she will realize her ambition.

The parents ought to prod her on and encourage her in every possible manner to study. She will be most attracted to and most successful in encompassing the devotional side of music, particularly on the pipe organ. This is shown by the placement of Saturn in the ninth house governing church or religious work, and the inspiration comes from his trine with Neptune in Cancer, the inspirational, psychic sign.

At the time of Mildred's birth, Neptune was rising in Cancer. This configuration suggests a tendency to colds, and Cancer is a sign of poor vitality; hence it will be well to guard Mildred against these tendencies. It also gives a tendency to trouble with the stomach, and Mars in Scorpio is apt to produce hemorrhoids if her desire for highly spiced food is indulged.

SARAH JUNE W. — Born June 14, 1914, 2:30 p.m., Skandaken, New York.

At the time of Sarah's birth, four cardinal signs were on the angles, giving her an active nature and showing that she

will be a leader among her associates in whatever sphere of life she may be placed. However, we find the planets grouped in two clusters. One is up in the ninth and tenth houses near to the zenith; the other is in the fourth and fifth houses, close to the nadir. This shows that Sarah will exert herself particularly in two certain directions; she will not be versatile like the people who have planets scattered all over their horoscopes.

The next thing that strikes us is that we have here a person of an unusual mentality, for Mercury and the Moon, which are signifiers of the mind, aspect each other by a trine, and Jupiter, the ruler of the ninth sign, is in the intellectual sign Aquarius and trine to the Sun and Saturn, which are in the mercurial sign Gemini. This aspect makes for general success in life and imparts many of the most valuable qualities to the mind and disposition, so that Sarah has a mind of a very deep and profound nature capable of understanding the most abstruse problems and grappling with the deepest phases of learning. It will make her honest, sincere, and just in her dealings with all about her, and will give her a financial ability that will ensure her success in life or make her comfortably situated in that respect. Furthermore, she will not squander whatever means she may possess, but will use them with care and conservatism. From the Sun trine Jupiter she will gain friendship from people in influential positions who will be able to help her materially in life, and she will always conduct herself with such circumspection that she will keep the esteem of people, for she will have a great desire to stand well in the eyes of the community.

In the horoscope of a woman this aspect also offers suc-

cess in marriage with a rise in the social scale through that event, for the Sun in a woman's horoscope signifies the marriage partner. In the horoscope of a man, it affects the health as the Sun rules that matter in the male figure. The Sun trine Jupiter will also give Sarah a religious disposition and an optimistic attitude of mind, but unfortunately, this aspect is modified by the conjunction of the Sun and Saturn. This always has a tendency to impart gloom to the nature. Therefore it may be expected that Sarah will at times feel gloomy and downcast in mind, though not to a very alarming degree, for this aspect should be more than offset by the sextile of Mars, the planet of dynamic energy, and the trine of Jupiter to the Sun. Their optimism and action tend to counteract the gloomy forces of Saturn. The Sun conjunction Saturn in Gemini will also give Sarah some difficulty in expressing herself. She will never be a chatterbox, and may not have even the ordinary fluency of speech, but what she says will count for it will be the fruit of profound thought.

The conjunction of Venus, the planet of love, art, and beauty, with Neptune and Mercury, which occurs in the emotional and inspirational sign Cancer, shows us that Sarah has musical ability of no mean order, and that she will probably not only be a performer of other people's compositions, but will also be an original composer. This talent should by all means be cultivated, and there is no doubt that she will come to the front. Mars, the planet of dynamic energy in the bold and intrepid sign of the Lion, sextile to the Sun and Saturn, shows that there is not only energy but also a great deal of persistence which will enable her to attain her object in life. She



will rise by the sheer force of her ambition, but this remark also brings us to her faults.

She is liable, through the forcefulness of her character and the way in which she may have to battle to get to the front, to become domineering and bombastic, as seen by the opposition of Mars to Jupiter. This tenth house position of Mars and the opposition of Jupiter shows that on that account she will lay herself liable to public criticisms, scandal, and other unpleasantness. You will therefore help her materially if you try to teach her self control, patience, and forbearance. It should not be difficult with a logical, fair, and powerful mind such as she has, to keep her unworthy emotions in check, and thus save herself a great deal of trouble in the future.

With respect to health, we find that the Moon is in conjunction with the Dragon's Head. This is in its effect like the Sun and Jupiter, therefore very good. The Moon is also trine to Mercury and thus we see that the nervous system is of an excellent nature. But the Sun and Saturn being in conjunction in the mercurial sign Gemini shows that there is a tendency to some obstruction in the lungs, though as already said, the sextile of Mars and the trine of Jupiter will do very much to offset that, so even this configuration may not show itself in any marked manner. An ounce of prevention, however, is worth more than a pound of cure, and in view of this you should therefore take precautions in childhood so that she does not catch cold, or if she does, see that she is properly taken care of. You will then probably save her an attack of illness in later life. Taken all in all, it is a very fortunate horoscope, showing a success in life above the average.
